### 80 Years of 'Gone With the Wind'

In December 1939, the blockbuster movie "Gone With the Wind" premiered.

Costing about \$4 million, the Civil War epic was one of the most expensive films ever made at the time.

More than 1,400 actresses were interviewed for the role of Scarlett O'Hara. Filming had already begun when Vivien Leigh was cast.

Gary Cooper turned down the role of Rhett Butler, and Clark Gable was chosen to play the character.

The day of the film's premiere was declared a state holiday in Georgia. An estimated 300,000 people lined Atlanta's streets to catch a glimpse of the movie's stars.

The landmark film won eight Academy Awards.
